Dear all,

Firstly, thanks to all for the continued warm welcome I've received to this great community. I'm thoroughly enjoying getting to know everyone, and very much appreciate the patience being shown by those whose names I've learned... and then forgotten again!

The start of term has already been busy in all the classes. Our year 6s are fully into SATs prep, and working really hard towards these. Year 5 have been writing up stories of their dreams (there's some weird things in those!), whilst years 3 and 4 have been learning some really interesting facts about Rainforests. In year 1 and 2, the pupils have been thinking about 'mysteries' – it's all been very philosophical down there! Sporting Successes – it's been a busy few weeks for our sports teams! Our Y5/6 Tag Rugby team came 2nd in their Level 2 (regional) tournament, narrowly missing out on qualifying for the next stage. Our Key Steps Gymnastics teams also did fantastically in their Level 2 event: year 3/4 won bronze medals, and year 5/6 won silver in their category, missing out on qualifying for the county level by a score of just 1.6 – amazing work girls! And last, but by no means least, our year 5/6 netballers won their regional tournament, meaning they go through to the county level in July! Well done to all.

Coffee Morning – thanks to all who attended our coffee morning recently, it was good to see a number of you there. We'll keep running these as a chance for you to spend some time together in school, it's a lovely opportunity for some of the staff and leadership team to chat with you too.

Book Fair – another thank you to all who have supported the book fair. We haven't had chance to count up all the sales, but this has a direct benefit to our school, as well as providing some great value reading material for your children!

Coats – it's been a week of extremely changeable weather – *please* ensure that your children come to school with a warm coat, even if the sun is shining in the morning, it could well be snowing by playtime!

Behaviour in school – we are working really hard at the moment to ensure consistent high standards are maintained among all our pupils. We do understand that a number of our children need certain adaptations, since they have particular needs / issues which cause them to struggle to regulate their behaviour. However, this is not case the for the majority of our pupils and we have had a few incidents recently of disrespectful behaviour towards members of staff or other children. We are making clear to pupils that this is totally unacceptable. Please support us by sending this message to your children and making clear to them the importance of following school rules and respecting both staff and each another. Thank you.
